
# Getting to The **Hague.**

The Hague is easy to reach from anywhere in the world. It is located in one of the best regions in Europe with easy access to two international airports and train stations.

Amsterdam Schiphol airport has 322 direct flight connections worldwide offered by 108 airlines. There is a direct train connection to The Hague Central Station and The Hague HS five-times per hour. Travel time is 29 min.

Furthermore, The Haguehas an outstanding and sustainable system of public transport, which makes it easy to find your way around the city. Trams and buses are extremely efficient and punctual, making sure that all delegates will get to their meetings on time. While the entire public transport network functions remarkably well, an alternative worth considering is walking to your destination within the town.

#### How to get to ISS

#### **Public transport**

From Central Station (CS): Bus 22 and 24 Stop: Mauritskade

From Hollands Spoor (HS): Tram 1 Stop: Mauritskade

Walking distance to ISS from Central Station is approximately 2 Km.

#### By car

Take the A13 direction The Hague

At the Junction Prins Clausplein, follow the signs The Hague (A12)/Scheveningen

At the end of the motorway, turn left direction Scheveningen-Zeehaven

At the end of this road follow direction Westeinde


Turn left at traffic lights and then take third road right: Zeestraat

Take the first street immediately left, this is the Kortenaerkade
